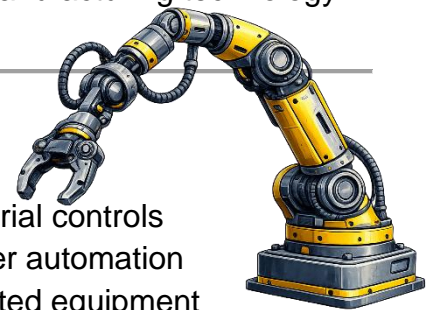

Introduction to Automation & Mechatronics is a hands-on, beginner-friendly course designed for individuals exploring careers in advanced manufacturing and industrial technology. Over 40 hours, students will learn foundational skills used in modern automated facilities — including basic programming, introduction to electricity, robotics, safety, and industry terminology.

This course is ideal for recent high school graduates or adults seeking a new career path. No prior experience is required. Students will gain practical, job-ready skills while building confidence in a supportive learning environment. Participants will also explore career pathways in automation, maintenance, robotics, and manufacturing technology.

What you will learn:

-  Learn the fundamentals of programming and industrial controls
-  Understand basic electricity and how systems power automation
-  Get hands-on experience with robotics and automated equipment
-  Explore high-demand careers in automation and advanced manufacturing
-  Key workplace safety fundamentals including hazard recognition, workers' rights, employer responsibilities, and how to prevent common injuries
